

Fabulous, Final Festival of Snowdrops

at EAST LAMBROOK MANOR GARDENS

Somerset's famous cottage garden at East Lambrook Manor will be holding what may be its final annual Festival of Snowdrops as it is hoped new owners will take over in the Spring.

Enjoy a stroll through a beautiful winter garden and view the extensive collection of unusual snowdrops.





The celebrated plantswoman and gardening writer Margery Fish, who created the iconic cottage garden, was a fan of double flowers it is not surprising that she was delighted by a gift of the double snowdrop, Galanthus 'Ophelia'. It sparked her interest in the genus and she became an avid collector of rare snowdrops, which she planted in an area she named The Ditch, fashioned from the drainage channel between two orchards.

"It's such a welcome sight to see the sides of The Ditch carpeted with snowdrops in February," says current owner Mike Werkmeister, "and it's where all the unusual snowdrops named for previous owners were found, most notably G. 'Margery Fish'. It's the sight I shall miss most when I move."

The garden has a collection of around 140 named varieties, and these are used to make a special display in a raised bed enabling visitors to appreciate the subtle and often not so subtle difference between them all. The best time to visit is mid-February as, if the weather is warm as in 2024, the snowdrops can be over before the month is out.



Around 90 varieties will be on sale in the nursery along with hellebores and other spring plants and bulbs. 'Sculptor Chris Kampf will be exhibiting his popular steel snowdrops.

The garden is open Tuesday to Sunday throughout February, 10am to 5pm.



Rangers Update

2024 was another wet year with 1039.5mm of rainfall compared to 693.5mm in 2022, which has left the park sodden in places – bring wellies! We had a lovely Christmas volunteer day to say thank you to our fantastic volunteers with a morning's work followed by a warming and festive lunch and even a carol rendition.

We're continuing to remove trees with Ash Dieback and to clear up those sadly swept over by the storms. We've also been fixing gates, furniture and fences and clearing areas in preparation for the new visitor centre.

Wildlife

Skylarks will be singing and displaying on a sunny day on the flat fields. There will be increased bird activity in general, and you may spot deer in Pit Wood or at the Western Ramparts.



In terms of flora, if the sheep haven't eaten them all (!) you can see the bright yellow flowers of Lesser Celandine and the pale yellow flowers of Primrose in Witcombe Valley. Dog's Mercury is one of the first woodland plants to spring up, carpeting patches of the woodland floor in green.

'Uncovering Ham Hill's past for its future' project update

It is an exciting time in the project as contractors are soon to be appointed for the main build work of the new Visitor Centre at Ham Hill, with work expected to commence in March. As part of these works, we need to start connecting services (water, electricity, digital) to the site of the new visitor centre in Lime Kiln car park. In order to do this, there will be some disruption to site and there will need to be some path closures as trenches are dug and pipes are laid. 

Ingredients:

400g plain flour 250g butter, at room temperature 2 eggs 200g caster sugar

Icing:

250g icing sugar

1-2 tablespoons lemon juice

1-2 tablespoons raspberry syrup (for pink colour) or food colouring if preferred

How to...

Work all the biscuit ingredients into a smooth dough. Wrap and chill for 2 hours.

Preheat oven to 200 C / Gas 6. Grease baking trays. Roll dough out to 5mm thickness and cut out heart shapes. Transfer to baking trays and bake for 15 minutes or until golden brown. Allow to cool.


For image 1- Stir half of the icing sugar with the lemon juice until smooth, until you have a thick icing. Spread the icing over half of the hearts. Mix the remaining icing sugar with syrup and coat the other side of the hearts with it. Allow the icing to set.

Alternatively, use food colouring for the icing and 'sprinkles' to decorate your biscuits.




