

EAST LAMBROOK MANOR GARDENS

FESTIVAL OF SNOWDROPS

Throughout February the famous cottage garden at East Lambrook Manor will be celebrating the snowdrop season once again with its annual, and possibly last, Festival of Snowdrops. Stroll through the beautiful winter garden and enjoy the wonderful collection of unusual snowdrops.

Cottage garden doyenne and avid 'galanthophile' Margery Fish and her husband Walter turned the drainage channel between two orchards into the perect place for planting her growing collection of snow-

drops in the 1940's and the bulbs have thrived there ever since. "It gladdens the heart to see the snowdrops lining the banks of the famous Ditch

in this gem of a garden," says owner Mike Werkmeister.

The garden has a collection of around 140 named varieties and many of these are used to make a special display in a raised bed enabling visitors to appreciate the subtle and often not so subtle difference between them. "Unless you are a snowdrop aficionado, or 'galanthophile', you are probably not aware of how varied they can be. Visitors are often amazed by the different shapes and colours of the flowers, including delicate Galanthus 'Margery Fish', found in the Ditch in 1987," explains Mike.





Visitors can join a snowdrop tour to learn about the genus and see some of the more unusual snowdrops in the garden. Around 80 varieties will be on sale in the nursery along with hellebores and other spring bulbs and plants. Sculptor **Chris Kampf** will again be exhibiting his popular steel snowdrops.



The garden is open Tuesday to Sunday throughout the festival from 10am to 5pm. Garden entry £7.00, Groups £6.50, under 16s free. Tours £4.00. The annual NGS Snowdrop Open Day is on Thurs.15th February, with all entry money going to charity. RHS members have free entry on Wednesdays. No charge if just visiting the café or nursery.

This series is all about using small spaces to grow food to eat.

Potager Spaces

You don't need a vegetable patch to grow food. When space is short, grow edibles amongst existing flower beds and borders.

Just make sure you're adding easily identifiable crops!

Broad beans are ideal - sow beans in February approx 5-7cm deep at 20 cm intervals towards the back of your border. Planting seeds in rows makes seedlings easy to spot, and not mistake them for weeds.

The plants sport pretty flowers (my favourite is Crimson Flowering) which soon set to pods. Harvest beans in May before the summer flowers put on their big display.

After harvesting all the pods, cut the plant stems to the ground but leave the roots in the ground to fix nitrogen and feed the soil.

February Seed Sowing

February is the start of the indoor seed sowing year but most seed packets contain far more seeds than small growers need!



Seed swaps help build up your range without breaking the bank.

Rangers update

After a very wet Christmas period, the rangers welcomed some slightly drier weather in January that allowed them to start removing dead or diseased ash tree, that might pose a risk to visitors. Unfortunately, many of the ash trees on Ham Hill are infected with ash dieback disease, which gradually affects their overall health and ability to remain standing. However, it seems that the mature trees are more resistant to this disease, which provides some hope for this species in the future. If you are fit enough to climb to the war memorial from the village, you may have noticed that the volunteers have been making some improvements to the steps along this route, making it (slightly!) easier to access the hilltop from Stoke.

'Uncovering Ham Hill's past for its future' project update

We are delighted to welcome Jasmine Ely into the Ham Hill ranger team. Jasmine is our Engagement Ranger at Ham Hill, and this post is fully funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund for three years. Jasmine's role will be to work with visitors, volunteers, and the local community to help people be more involved at Ham Hill. Jasmine will also be helping to tell the story of Ham Hill's rich history, through events, activities, and school visits. Geoff and his excellent dry stone walling volunteer team have now finished the wall repairs between Strouds West and Strouds East. A huge well done to the team! It has taken them 250 volunteer days (one person for one day = 1 volunteer day) to complete 100m of wall, which shows why a dedicated volunteer team was needed to carry out this work.

Since Geoff started the drystone wall repair team, as a volunteer himself, as 'lockdown' eased in the Spring of 2021, they have restored the 450m field wall dividing Strouds Meadow on the Ham Hill Plateau to being fully stockproof. This has involved 100m of complete rebuild, together with a 200m of partial rebuild: patching holes, increasing the height of low sections, replacing missing top stones etc.

Geoff is now leading a team of volunteers to open the exposed rock faces in the Geological SSSI so that visitors can view them more easily. The geological creation of Ham Hill is one of the themes that will be covered in the exhibition in the new Visitor Centre and once people understand the story, they will be able to go out on site and see the evidence to back it up.





Wildlife

Although February is the start of early spring, it can still seem like a drab winter month, depending on what the weather throws our way! However, there is still much to celebrate in nature. Snowdrops will be starting to bloom, creating a carpet of white in our woodlands. Head to Headgecock Woods or walk the ramparts on the western side of the hill to see these delicate flowers in bloom. Although delicate, they are mighty, and were so named due to their ability to push their stems up through snowladen soil.

Whilst the trees are still bare, it is also a good time to get the binoculars out for a bit of bird spotting. During the winter months, birds of different species flock together to



search for food and provide protection against the elements. These flocks can be quite gregarious and so are easy to spot. Members of the tit family (Great tits, blue titis, long tailed tits) often fly in small flocks in the tree tops at this time of year and goldfinches can be seen landing on teasel or thistle heads in the field margins.

Skylarks have already tentatively started singing so listen out for them as you walk across the flat fields.






