

#### This series is all about using small spaces to grow food to eat.

#### Look Up!

Warmer days in March seriously tempt us gardeners to start sowing ooodles of seeds, but beware: nights are cold and late frosts can wipe out ALL your hard work!

#### Outdoor tomatoes benefit from being sown inside now.

Sow seeds thinly in seed trays 0.5cm deep. Keep soil moist but not waterlogged. Seedlings show in 1-2 weeks.

Turn seed trays regularly to avoid seedlings becoming leggy and bent towards the light.

Pot up seedlings into individual pots once they have 2 sets of true leaves and approx. 10cm tall.



Plant deep as tomatoes throw out roots from a bedded stem.

Avoid using large pots as tomatoes prefer to be re-potted as they grow. It also saves on windowsill space!

Harden young plants off by putting them outside during the day, bringing them inside at night.

Plant outside once the risk of frost has passed (usually mid April).



If space is premium - Look Up! Cherry bush tomatoes are prolific and do very well in hanging baskets.

Water daily as bushy plants create an "umbrella" as they grow and rain alone may not get to thirsty roots.

Once the flowers are out, add tomato feed at every other watering.

Growing Tip: My grandmother added a cup of cold black tea to the watering can once a week to improve the flavour of tomatoes - I don't know why, but it really works!


#### Numerator

#### Rangers update

The rangers have been continuing with their winter management work which includes felling of trees that are infected with ash dieback. Ash dieback is caused by a fungus (Hymenoscyphus fraxineus) that specifically infects ash trees causing leaves and eventually branches to die and ultimately affecting the health of the tree. The rangers carry out annual tree safety surveys and only the trees that pose the highest risk to people or property will be felled. Dead and decaying trees are left where possible as they are good for wildlife too of course, providing habitat for other fungi, insects, birds and bats. Not all ash trees with ash dieback will die or need to be felled and it seems that the most mature trees have more resistance to the fungus, which gives some hope for the future of this species in Britain. The effect of ash dieback on our trees at Ham Hill will be apparent for everyone to see in the Spring when the trees start to get their leaves and many of the ash will remain leafless.

The rangers and volunteers were joined by the public on the 27<sup>th</sup> January to participate in a

community tree planting day at Pit Wood, in the far southwestern part of Ham Hill. Pit Wood is dominated by sycamore and after some selective thinning by the rangers, 410 native tree species including oak, hazel, hawthorn, field maple, rowan, crab apple, hornbeam, wild service and goat willow were planted by 28 willing helpers. Some of these species will provide a shrubbier layer to the woodland, valuable to small mammals such as dormice that inhabit Ham Hill. Other species will provide nectar for our pollinators and allow a greater diversity of life to exist in the woodland.



#### We need to talk about poo!

Over the last few months, the rangers have received more than a dozen complaints about the amount of dog poo that has not been picked up by dog owners on Ham Hill. The rangers have been out to mark the 'hotspots' and regrettably found that in many instances, the poo was left just a few meters away from a dog bin.

The rangers would like to remind all dog-owning visitors that they have a responsibility to pick up after their dog and put it in one of the 26 dog bins that can be found across Ham Hill. Rangers have the authority to patrol, enforce and publish Fixed Penalty Notices for offenders if necessary. Whilst we know that most of our dog walkers do pick up after their dog, it only takes two or three owners who walk there daily for the amount to build up.

Paull McNeill, Countryside Ranger says, "We are a busy site that relies on the help and trust of our regular visitors and over the years, you have been amazing, our 'eyes and ears'. Our time is spent looking after this beautiful space, protecting its wildlife and ensuring that our visitors stay safe too; not patrolling and enforcing. So again, I find myself asking for your help, please pick up your dog poo and put it in one of the red bins provided. Thank you."

#### Wildlife



By late march spring is really underway with blossom blooming on the blackthorn trees, bluebell leaves carpeting the woodland floor and **yellow celandines** brightening up the dreariest of days.

Blackthorn is one of the first native species to blossom, with blooms emerging from early February. They are not to be confused with Hawthorn which blossoms later in April-May, hence

it's common name, May Tree. The blackthorn blossoms before its leaves emerge whilst hawthorn do it the other way around, with leaves emerging from mid-February onwards.

Make the most of the bare trees while they last and brush up on your bird ID. The birds really start getting vocal this month and before they all launch into full song, take the opportunity to learn a few of the more common species. It helps that you can still see them in the treetops before the leaves emerge. Here are a couple for you to learn with some identification tips.



Song Thrush (*Turdus philomelos*) Sits at the top of a tree or large bush to sing. Quite a stout bird, approximately the same size as a blackbird, with a more rounded 'tummy'. Its song is a series of repeated notes, it will call one note, repeat it several times, before moving onto the next note.



Dunnock (*Prunella modularis*) often called a hedge sparrow, will sit atop a patch of bramble, hedgerow or other shrubs, flicking its wings as it moves when it is disturbed. The dunnocks call is very pretty and underrated, a continuous series of high-pitched notes, sang as if in a rush to talk.



Great Tit (*Parus major*) can be separated from the similar blue tit as being larger in size, with a black head and bold black stripe down it's chest. The great tit loves woodlands and gardens, and bird boxes! Its song is a simple repeat of two notes that sound like it is saying 'tea-cher, tea-cher, tea-cher'.


#### 'Uncovering Ham Hill's past for its future' project update

Geoff and his team of volunteers are continuing with work on the dry stone wall, as it leaves the fields and goes down into Hedgecock Woods. To celebrate all the work they have done, a new date stone has been set into the wall to memorialise the year in which the wall was rebuilt.

The volunteers have been helping to clear back scrub from some of the main paths across the site, partly to aid access for visitors but also in preparation of repair works to take place in the spring. The repairs works will be done with machinery so please adhere to 'footpath closed' signs and temporary diversions if you visit over the next few months. The work to the footpaths will help to prevent erosion, particularly on the sensitive rampart paths and provide a more durable surfacing for the winter months.




