





This series is all about using small spaces to grow food to eat

Using what you have.

Well, I haven't known a growing year quite like 2024 and I've been growing for a while now!

Everything is about a month behind and the low overnight temperatures at the beginning of June were the final straw for many of our poor veggies. But, looking at the positives, late sowings are well worth taking a risk (and let's hope for a long summer!).

So this month is all about using whatever you can lay your hands on to increase your growing space! Rows of shopping bags are very successful in lieu of "grow bags". Black buckets and bins melt into the background when planted up, or make a "feature" by repurposing broken suitcases / baskets / watering cans and wheelbarrows. I love see-

particularly good at supporting single canes and sweet potato plants), and even shoes can support a crop of radishes.

Taking the idea further, nail old denim jeans onto a rail, dig the hems into the ground or tuck into boots and fill with compost and plants!

The general rule of thumb is if your container leaks, add a lining to prevent compost from leaching out, and if the container is watertight, avoid over-watering or make some drainage holes.

Apart from that ... just let your imagination (and your growing space) go wild.





Rangers update

With the arrival of the new tractor, the rangers have been busily cutting back spring growth and mowing paths to ensure access for visitors. Volunteers have provided the paths with a 'walking haircut', ensuring that paths are clear of overhanging vegetation. The volunteers have also been out in force in Witcombe Valley; this time cutting thistles to prevent them from dominating the grassland and to allow other flowering species a chance to establish. The rangers and volunteers have also been busy trimming back encroaching undergrowth in the woodlands to increase the light levels reaching the ground, encouraging flowering species like Wood Avens, Wood Anemone and Lesser Celandine to establish.

Great work continues from the dry stone walling team. The last of the coping stones have been put in place on the T junction between Strouds' East and Strouds' West. This completes this wall and restores the 400 year old parish boundary wall between Montacute and Stoke-sub-Hamdon.

The South West branch of the Dry Stone Walling Association (SWEDSWA) organised a walling course in collaboration with the rangers. During the rebuild of the wall, the wallers discovered a rare intact belemnite fossil. This fossil is actually the internal 'guard' of an extinct squid-like organism, and a reminder of the fascinating geological history of Ham Hill.









Wildlife

As we move into the summer months, the yellows that were awash in the park through spring turn to pinks and purples as we welcome back the incredible display of orchids. This year, the first Bee Orchid was spotted by a couple of our wildlife surveyors in the plateau fields. Look out for these fascinating flowers around the field margins and on the Northern Spur. This clever mimic tricks male bees into pollinating the flower by imitating a female bee. However, the right bee species does not live in the UK, so the orchid self-pollinates here.

The plateau fields are also alive with swifts and swallows at the moment. These summer visitors to the UK can be spotted displaying their aerial acrobatics over the grassland. Swallows (*Hirundo rustica*) can be identified from their forked tail with long streamers, and a red patch under the throat. Swifts (*Apus apus*) have shorter tails and proportionately longer wings. If you hear a screeching bird call overhead, look to the skies to see a superb flying display from the swifts.

'Uncovering Ham Hill's past for its future' project update

Our amazing team of wildlife surveying volunteers have made a great start surveying the plateau fields for bumblebees and butterflies. Bumblebee numbers have been strong, particularly for the Early bumblebee (Bombus pratorum), so-called because it is typically one of the first bumblebees to emerge in spring. There has, however, been a lack of butterflies so far. This is likely due to the recent cooler temperatures. The team also completed early season vegetation surveys. This will form



part of the baseline data prior to the work that the rangers will begin in autumn to diversify the field margins.

We successfully trialled a potential new waymarking system in June. This new system was designed to make the site easier to navigate. Thank you to our consultation group and members of the public who took part. We're grateful for all the feedback we received, which we will be looking at with our interpretation designer as we move forward with developing site signage.





In this personal journey, Australia was his next destination. "I have spent the best years of my life in Oz and I am sure that my time here will be most productive and health giving".

The Sunrise swims, feeling the oceans energy go through his body and soul, then painting all day off old photos from the many years of travelling.

Then venturing out into the bush and beaches to paint some more, resulted in a handsome portfolio of new and exciting work.

Moish tackled a new subject matter – Flowers. "I never saw myself as a flower painter but I thought its time!" Included in his new work are the many painted scenes of his favourite countryside in Somerset, the seasons marking the passing of time.
